


##CYJ24 ROM 12:12 KEY SCRIPTURE PASSAGE







HECTJ24 ROM 12:12

TNTRODUCTION

Each year, the Pope selects a pastoral theme of focus for the Youth of the Church. The purpose of each theme, quoted from Scripture, is to invite young disciples across the world to live their faith as authentic pilgrims journeying with Jesus, in the Spirit, to the Father's house. This tradition is rooted in the World Youth Day (WYD) initiative instituted by Pope St. John Paul II in 1985. Each year, WYD was to be celebrated on Palm Sunday until Pope Francis moved it to the annual Feast of Christ the King in 2020. Every 2 to 3 years, a large inter-continental version of WYD is celebrated in a host country selected by the Pope. The next one will in Lisbon, Portugal, from 1 to 6 Aug 2023. Between these main gatherings, WYD is celebrated on local level.

By embracing the Pope's selected themes in the spirit of pilgrimage young people have an opportunity to enrich our spiritual lives by engaging with the Word deeply, exploring resources that can enlighten us, sharing our faith with fellow youth, embracing mission as young agents of evangelisation, deepening our personal relationships with Jesus in our private and communal spaces of prayer, and experiencing conversion into ever-better versions of ourselves for God's



Below is the monthly theme card for January 2024, "Rejoice in Hope". The key theme of 2024 was launched on the feast of Christ the King, 26 Nov 2023, and is taken from the Rom 12:12, "Rejoicing in hope". This is the theme we will be exploring this year. The purpose of every subtheme is to deepen our exploration of this key theme through scriptural reflections, resources and various activities. Throughout the coming year detailed theme cards and other materials will be broadcast to parishes and on our social media platforms. We will seek to interact with youth from a diversity of backgrounds and invite them to share their stories with us on these same platforms.



1. Organise a simple retreat focused on themes of joy and hope. Speak to your parish priest about preparing presentations or getting a guest speaker. Recruit youth to share stories of their own journeys in hope and joy. Plan a special prayer liturgy focused on seeking hopeful joy. Speak to your priest about including Adoration and Confession. Another option is to organize a Silent Retreat.

2. Do a virtual Novena to the saint of the month (St. Therese of Lisieux) or another saint selected by your youth group, e.g. your parish/group patron saint or patrons of hope and joy such as St. Jude, St. Philip Neri and St. Martha. Use your youth group social media platforms to promote and maximise participation.


3. Prayerfully explore the thematic Bible passages during your youth gatherings. This can also

be done through WhatsApp groups or other social media platforms.

4. Plan your youth gatherings for the month around the given theme. Explore some of the resources provided and seek more with the help of your parish priest or catechists.

PRIVATE

1. Examine your own interior posture of hope and joy. 2. Do a private novena to the saint of the month or a saint of your choice. 3. If you haven't already, try making the Rosary a regular prayer/mediation practice. 4. Consider seeking spiritual direction. 5. Try to attending Mass daily or more than once a week.

DEANERY YOUTH MASS


Youth Mass remains a highlight and has proven to be a powerful and empowering spiritual encounter for young people. Whether celebrated on its own or as part of other deanery activities (as listed below), we invite the Deanery Youth Forum (DYF) of every deanery to plan this celebration and welcome all youth within your respective deaneries.

YOUTH DAY (JUNE 16)

Deaneries have celebrated vibrant youth day events over the years filled with creative uniqueness. As a lead-up to AMOF, we invite DYF's to make Youth Day celebrations celebrated on June 16 a priority. This day can include multiple activities such as Youth Mass, spiritual formation activities, listening circles, culture and sport activities, fundraising initiatives (e.g. raffles, food and merchandise sales), etc. Our virtual connections via social media make this a multi-centred occasion by which we are apart yet one in this celebration. WORLD YOUTH DAY (CHRIST THE KING SUNDAY)

Pope Francis has moved the annual global Youth Day celebration to the feast of Christ the King each year. Since our local Youth Day celebrations are celebrated in June (AMOF JOZI & June 16), we invite Parish Youth Forum (PYF) leaders to work with their respective parish pastoral councils (PPC's) in planning a special parish Youth Mass for this feast. Mass can be followed by fun and fellowship activities facilitated by the youth for all parishioners. This celebration also serves as a launching platform for the upcoming theme of the



HECHJ24 ROM 12:12 DEFINITIONS

CYJ = CATHOLIC YOUTH JOZI

The archdiocesan catholic youth body. #CYJ23 refers to all things pertaining to the youth of the Johannesburg archdiocese. The year is specified, as a key theme (usually a scripture verse) is at the core of all events, gatherings and resources that will be produced in that year. The 'CYJ Mass' is a celebration open to all youth during which we give thanks for the year behind us and consecrate that before us to Jesus.

AYF = ARCHDIOCESAN YOUTH FORUM

The AYF refers to the archdiocesan body of parish youth leaders, i.e. all Parish Youth Forum (PYF) chairpersons. This can be viewed as a youth version of the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council (APC). The '**AYF Encounter'** is therefore a leadership platform by which we aspire to form, inform, inspire and connect parish youth leaders.

PYF = PARISH YOUTH FORUM

The Parish Youth Forum (PYF) consists of all parish youth. PYF leaders are referred to as the 'PYF Executive'.

DYF = DEANERY YOUTH FORUM

The Deanery Youth Forum (DYF) consists of the chairpersons and secretaries of every PYF in a given deanery. Deanery leaders are elected from the DYF to form the 'DYF Executive'.

WYD = WORLD YOUTH DAY

World Youth Day is celebrated every year across the world on the feast of Christ the King. One particular large gathering is celebrated every three years in a selected host country. The next large gathering ('WYD2023') will in be Lisbon, Portugal from 1-6 Aug.

AMOF = ARCHDIOCESAN MEETING OF FAMILIES

One of our newest and biggest archdiocesan events, now officially hosted by the Youth department in collaboration with the Marriage & Family Life and Evangelisation departments. 'AMOF JOZI' has been instituted as the official youth event that will be celebrated each year in June (youth month). This event is by the youth, for the church!

ALC = ARCHDIOCESAN LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

Another new and large archdiocesan event hosted by the Evangelisation department in collaboration with the Youth and Marriage & Family Life departments. ALC has been instituted as the official leadership formation event that will be celebrated each year on the Saturday before World Mission Sunday. This event is for all church leadership and welcomes aspiring leaders.
